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### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF VIRINCHI HEALTHCARE PRIVATE LIMITED Report on the Audit of Financial Statements

#### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of VIRINCHI HEALTHCARE PRIVATE LIMITED ("the Company"), which Comprises the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2025, the Statement of Profit and Loss (including Other Comprehensive Income), the Statement of Changes in Equity and the Statement of Cash Flows for the year ended on that date, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the financial statements").

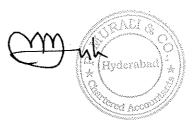
In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended, ("Ind AS") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2025, its loss and total comprehensive income, changes in equity and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

#### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit of the financial statements in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under section 143(10) of the Act (SAs). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of CharteredAccountants of India (ICAI) together with the independence requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI's Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the financial statements.

#### **Key Audit Matters**

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the Standalone financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the consolidated financial statements as





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a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on this matter.

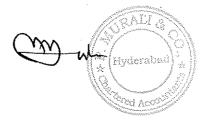
Depending on the facts and circumstances of the entity and the Audit, we have determined the matters described below to be the key audit matters to be communicated in our report.

#### **Emphasis of Matter**

The company has incurred losses and net worth of the company has eroded. It raises substantial doubt about the company's ability to continue as going concern. According to the information and explanations given to us, The Company's management expects that company will generate the profits in the near future and the net worth of the company will improve accordingly, hence these financial statements have been prepared on the basis of going concern assumption.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

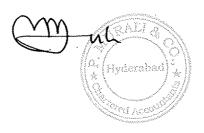
If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information; we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

The Board of Directors is responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.





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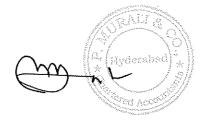
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#### Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

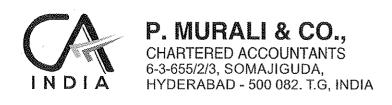
#### Management's Responsibility for Internal Financial Controls

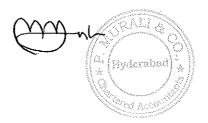
We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the internal financial controls system over financial reporting of the Company.

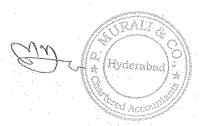

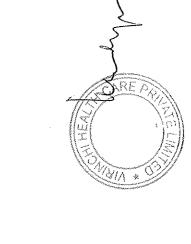


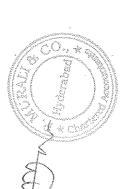
